By The Numbers: Fiscal Year 2022-2023

426 individuals served with 3-6 months of counseling per client (**48% increase** in clients served from FY 2022)

4,070 counseling sessions provided (38% increase from FY 2022)

72 mental health check-ins at community partner sites

24 group sessions

77% of new clients were uninsured

49% of clients reported making \$30,000 or less

64% of sessions were provided free of charge

87% of counseling sessions were provided for \$25 or less

Our Services

Individual, Couples, and Family Counseling

The core of our services is providing individual, couples, and family counseling to help adults work through issues that include: anxiety, depression, PTSD/trauma, addiction recovery, grief and loss, postpartum depression, parenting issues, gender identity and sexual orientation (LGBTQ+ affirming), domestic/family violence, physical/sexual assault, and relationship challenges. Our therapists have a minimum of 5 years of post-master's clinical experience and use a wide range of modalities including: Cognitive Behavior Therapy (CBT), Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing (EMDR), Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT), and trauma-informed therapy. Our services are available in-person at our Center or through tele-health (virtual sessions). We also have bilingual English/Spanish counseling available.

Group Therapy

ASCC provides group therapy based on specific needs and mental health issues that arise. In partnership with National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI), we hosted an 8-week "Survivors of Suicide Loss" group in Fall 2022 and in Spring 2023. We also held a 12-week Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT) group in Spring 2023.

On-site Services and Community Programs

We believe in making mental health care as accessible as possible, which is why we started "meeting clients where they are" at community partner sites. We are thrilled to have partnered with The Red Door/Church of the Advocate, Haywood Street Congregation, and ABCCM's Transformation Village to provide on-site therapy one day per week to support community members through mental health "check-ins".

In partnership with the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) Western Carolina, we held our 6th Annual Mental Wellness Walk in September 2022! This event helps to raise awareness of the mental health resources available in our region and end the stigma around seeking help. Unfortunately, due to inclement weather, our event was held virtually.

Recent Accomplishments in FY 2023

Outreach and Community Engagement

In Fall 2022, we received American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding that allowed us to hire a full-time Outreach and Community Engagement Manager! Victoria Hensley started working for ASCC in November and, since her start date, has met with over over 50 organizations, businesses, and community groups. When she's not doing all the behind the scenes of our social media, she is attending community meetings and events, such as the Craggy Correctional Center's Transitional Fair, school health fairs, and the annual Martin Luther King, Jr. Prayer Breakfast.
